ENTRY REQUIREMENTS TO SOUTH KOREA

The South Korean authorities have introduced requirements for customers arriving in the country.

Please note that entry restrictions might be subject to change on short notice. All customers are responsible for ensuring that they are allowed entry into the country they are travelling from, to or are in transit through.

- Several foreign travellers previously visa-exempt now need to obtain a visa to enter the country (excluding APEC Business Travel Card-holders)
- Foreign residents of Korea will need a re-entry permit and
 a medical certificate issued earliest 48 hours prior to
 travel, indicating that they do not have COVID-19
 symptoms (a COVID-19 negative laboratory test result is
 not required prior to travel). This medical certificate
 requirement only applies to residents who have left South
 Korea after 1 June 2020.

- Temperature screening will be performed at the departure gate in Helsinki for passengers travelling to Korea. Those not fulfilling the health requirements set by the Korean health authorities and those showing symptoms of COVID-19 will be denied boarding.
- On arrival, you will be tested for fever and respiratory symptom at the entry health screening as well as for COVID-19, and you must stay at a designated quarantine facility for 1 or 2 days until a test result is obtained.
- In addition, you need to stay at a designated quarantine facility for 14 days at your own expense.
- All arriving passengers are required to download a Self-Diagnosis Mobile App.
