

在当前的情况下，各个目的地的入境规定可能会在短时间内更改。自**2021年1月14日起**，**旅客从风险地区进入德国的规定再次更新。**

从被罗伯特·科赫研究所（Robert Koch Institute）划为风险地区的国家/地区入境德国的旅客，必须在进入时提供 Covid-19 检测阴性证明。6岁以下的儿童免于接受检测或提供证明的义务。

自 2021 年 1 月 14 日起，风险地区已被划分为三个风险等级，分别适用不同的义务：

- **1 级 – 风险地区**：必须在抵达后 48 小时内完成测试义务（抗原或 PCR 测试）
- **2 级 – 高风险地区**：必须在入境前 48 小时内完成测试义务（抗原或 PCR 测试）。若无法提供阴性证明，该旅客将被拒绝运输。仅在德意志联邦共和国过境的**旅客无需测试**
- **3 级 – 发生病毒突变的风险地区**：必须在入境前 48 小时内完成测试义务（抗原或 PCR 测试），这也适用于仅在德意志联邦共和国过境的旅客。若无法提供阴性证明，该旅客将被拒绝运输

Entering Germany

Current regulations for entry into the Federal Republic of Germany for travellers from risk areas

In connection with the coronavirus SARS-CoV-2 and the infectious disease Covid-19, extended regulations apply for entry into Germany. The regulations refer to regions that are classified as risk areas by the Robert Koch Institute.

Since 14 January 2021, the Robert Koch Institute has divided the risk areas into **three risk levels** for which different obligations apply:

Level 1: risk areas

Level 2: high-risk areas

Level 3: virus variant areas (regions with occurring virus mutations)

Entry regulations according to risk levels

Entry from risk areas

All persons entering Germany from a level 1 risk area are required to provide evidence of a negative Corona/Covid 19 test. The test can be carried out up to **48 hours after entry** and reported to the competent authorities. The ten-day **quarantine requirement**, and the **Digital Entry Application** (DEA) or a replacement application remain mandatory for all entrants.

Certain groups of persons are exempt from the **registration and proof requirement**. These include:

- Persons entering the Federal Republic of Germany for transit purposes only.
- Persons who have only stayed in a risk area for 24 hours or who will stay in the Federal Republic of Germany for a maximum of 24 hours.
- Children up to and including 6 years of age are exempt from the obligation to provide proof of testing but not from the obligation to register.

The quarantine regulations are the responsibility of the individual federal states (entry quarantine regulations, e.g. **Hesse**, **Bavaria**, **North Rhine-Westphalia**, etc. – German only). Please enquire independently how the quarantine regulations are specifically applied in your federal state.

To the entry quarantine regulations of the federal states (German only)

Information on the quarantine obligation

As a general rule, persons entering or returning from abroad who have stayed in a risk area (levels 1 to 3) within the last ten days before entry are obliged to enter a **ten-day quarantine** immediately after entry.

From the fifth day after entry, it is possible to be tested for the coronavirus and to end the quarantine prematurely if the test result is negative. This test after five days at the earliest is also necessary if a negative test result was available at or before entry (two-test strategy).

Important note for exemptions from the quarantine obligation

In the Federal Republic of Germany, the regulations regarding the quarantine obligation (e.g. shortening or exceptions) are the responsibility of the federal states. There may be different regulations and measures in the individual federal states (entry quarantine regulations, e.g. [Hesse](#), [Bavaria](#), [North Rhine-Westphalia](#), etc. – German only).

Please check the website of the federal state in which you reside or will be accommodated to find out how the quarantine regulations are actually implemented there.

To the entry quarantine regulations of the federal states (German only)

Since 1 December 2020, the test is subject to a fee. Test centres are available in Frankfurt, Munich and at many other German airports for testing on entry.

To the test centres at German airports

Unfortunately, Lufthansa cannot provide any information about the testing possibilities at departure points outside Germany. Information on local testing facilities can be obtained from the local authorities.

More information on the quarantine regulation

Please note

If, despite a negative test result, the typical symptoms of an infection with the SARS-CoV-2 virus, such as fever, dry cough and loss of the sense of taste or smell, occur within ten days of entry, you are obliged in any case to inform your competent authority.
