

Travel regulations for flights to or via Switzerland

Restrictions are still in place for travel to and transit in Switzerland for [many countries](#). Urgently take note of the detailed [information on this page](#). Generally, a negative Covid-19 test result and the completion of an [entry form \(ePLF\)](#) are still required.

Exceptions are in place for, among others, fully vaccinated passengers and guests under 16 years of age, unless originating in a risk country with a worrying variant according to the [current list by the Federal Office of Public Health](#). Passengers only transiting in Switzerland within 24 hours and without leaving the airport are exempted from the test requirement. The entry form still needs to be completed.

Transfer via Zurich: Simplified rules for vaccinated passengers, effective 7 June 2021

Simplified rules now apply for passengers traveling to Switzerland on an international flight (from a Non-Schengen country) with a connecting flight to a Schengen country. Provided that the requirements of the destination country are met, a transfer in Switzerland is now possible. Prerequisites are a confirmed ticket for a direct onward flight within 24 hours, proof of full vaccination against Covid-19, and all other documentation as required from the destination country.
