International students travelling to Canada

International students travelling to Canada should observe the following requirements from the IRCC and the Consulate of Canada in Hong Kong, especially in deciding on the appropriate time to travel:

"When you arrive in Canada

A border services officer (BSO) will make the final decision on whether you're eligible to enter Canada when you arrive. When the border services officer greets you, they consider

- vour reason for travelling to Canada
- your ability to comply with all the <u>mandatory COVID-19 requirements</u>, <u>unless</u> you're exempt
- your ability to comply with your approved DLI's COVID-19 readiness plan
 - o This may include a <u>14-day quarantine period</u>.
- proof that you have enough money to support yourself and any family members who come with you to Canada
- whether you've completed an immigration medical examination if required and the results are still valid
- the timing of your arrival
 - o You should give yourself enough time before school starts, to
 - complete the mandatory COVID-19 requirements
 - meet any requirements in your approved DLI's COVID-19 readiness plan
 - o If you arrive too early, you may be refused entry by the BSO."

M'Reminder: International students can arrive in Canada up to 30 days before the program start date on your Proof of Acceptance (POA). If you arrive too early, you may be refused entry by border services officers. You should give yourself enough time before school starts to complete the mandatory COVID-19 entry and quarantine requirements. 14
