### An exceptionally strong Thanksgiving operation

- Completion factor: We ran our best Thanksgiving period completion factor since 2017 and our best-ever controllable completion factor for the holiday period. That means that of our nearly 50,000 flights, we had only 28 cancels due to controllable factors. In fact, mainline had four consecutive zero-cancel days, which is the first time since the merger. And our regional operation saw one zero-cancel day.
- On-time departures: We ranked second among our major competitors. In fact, our Nov. 25 D-0 performance was our best daily performance since March 2, 2022.

### JAL Signs New SAF Agreements with Neste OYJ and Itochu Corporation 日本航空与Neste OYJ和 Itochu商事签署新的SAF协议

As part of its ongoing commitment to sustainability, JAL has signed agreements with Neste OYJ, the largest renewable fuels producer in the world, and its branded distributor in Japan, Itochu Corporation for the procurement of Sustainable Aviation Fuel (SAF). Specific initiatives include the purchase and usage of SAF on at our LAX station in November 2022, the purchase and usage of SAF on JAL's Sustainable Charter Flight on November 18, 2022, and an MoU with Itochu Corporation to discuss the procurement and supply of SAF during JAL's fiscal year 2023. JAL has set a goal to replace 1% of its fuel with SAF by fiscal year 2025, and 10% by fiscal year 2030.

### JAL Announces Plan to Join American at JFK's Terminal 8 日本航空宣布计划加入美国航空在肯尼迪国际机场的8号航站楼

JAL will be relocating its flight operations to the state-of-the-art Terminal 8 facility at John F. Kennedy Int'l Airport. The newest PJB co-location, expected in May 2023, will provide customers of both airlines with smoother, faster, and more convenient connections for travel to and from Tokyo and beyond on JAL, and throughout the U.S., Central and South America on American.

# JAL Takes Further Steps to Reduce Single-use Plastic Onboard 日本航空采取进一步措施减少机上使用一次性塑料产品

Expanding on its commitment to sustainability, JAL is taking further steps to replace single-use plastics onboard its aircraft to meet its goal of eliminating all new petroleum-derived single-use plastics in its cabin and lounges by fiscal year 2025. Initiatives being implemented include the replacement of plastic lids used on paper cups and drink stirrers on international and domestic flights with alternatives made from paper. Paper tray mats having been introduced on International Economy Class from August 2022, and containers and lids for main dishes will be replaced and used from January 2023. Collectively, together with other initiatives, a reduction of over 500 tons of new single-use plastic per year is expected.
